OUR IMPACT

Expanding Competitive Opportunities

Thanks to donor support, we successfully launched a
Tier I team in the Midwest Sled Hockey League — a
crucial step for athletes aiming for the U.S paralympic
team. This team provides a high-performance
environment where elite players sharpen their skills and
chase Paralympic dreams.

Five athletes advanced from our Tier 4 adult team to compete at the Tier 1 level — a clear sign of growth made possible by our investment in development.

Our Tier 1 roster proudly includes one **U.S. Women's National Team** alternate and six **Team Canada Paralympians,**reinforcing our role in preparing athletes for international success.

OURIMPACT

Community Outreach and Awareness

We introduced 36 new participants to the sport through three Try Sled Hockey clinics — often their first time ever on the ice.

We reached over 6,000 people by attending 11 community events, sharing the power and possibilities of adaptive hockey with families, fans, and future athletes.

Every dollar contributed helped expand awareness and inclusion

We, in partnership with Meijer
State Games, Mary Free Bed
Wheelchair and Adaptive Sports,
and U.P. Sled Hockey, hosted a 3on-3 tournament in Gaylord,
Michigan, using fast-paced action
to grow awareness of sled hockey
across the region.

Removing Barriers, Creating Access

Because of your support, players didn't have to choose between paying medical bills and playing the sport they love.

We supported **44 players** this year — and for many, that meant everything from travel to tournaments to having the right equipment.

We hosted **two tournaments**, welcoming over **200 athletes**, creating more competitive opportunities and showcasing our players on home ice.

We provided equipment to 12 players, and 44 athletes had their tournament registration covered — giving them the chance to compete without financial strain.




Without your support, we couldn't do it. Here's a breakdown of our financials for the year.
